



The Legacy Cup Committee of the American Hunter-Jumper Foundation would like to welcome you to the second arrival of the Legacy Cup. This year's dates are May 1-5, 2002 and our event will once again be held at the Virginia Horse Center in Lexington, VA. This fine facility houses 750 permanent stalls, an indoor coliseum with a ring space of 150x300', ample seating and plenty of room for our shops and vendors. Last year, not only did the showing area prove to be top quality, but the many schooling areas and hundreds of acres of riding in the rolling Virginia landscape were enjoyed by everyone. The people of the Virginia Horse Center could not have been better hosts.

The basic format of the Legacy Cup will remain the same. We offer four divisions. Two pro divisions, one at 3' one at 3'6" and, within the pro division, we award new or developing riders separate Limited Pro awards and prize money. There are two non-pro divisions, again at 3' and 3'6". Each division has two go-rounds to rank the top twenty horses, based on their composite scores, for a clean slate final. All rounds are judged numerically by four sets of two judges positioned around the ring. We will feature the \$5,000 Legacy Cup Under Saddle that carries no additional entry fee. The \$5,000 Challenge of the Breeds will also remain in place. This pays \$1,500 to the owner's of the top placed Thoroughbred, Quarter Horse and Warmblood, with an additional \$500 going to the horse accumulating the most money. And, finally we will award the \$15,000 Pre Green Incentive, distributing money to the top eight Pre-green horses showing in the 3' Pro Division.

We have made several changes to the second annual Legacy Cup in hopes of making this year's event even nicer. The first change is to have a five-day format. This allows non-pro riders to delay the start of their showing until Friday, with the Legacy Cup itself as the feature event on Saturday evening. We have instituted Invitational classes for both the non-pro divisions fashioned after the 3'6" Pro Invitational. These classes are for riders who do not qualify for their respective finals, thereby guaranteeing three classes for everyone for the same entry fee. Also, in addition to the overall ribbons presented to the non-pro riders, we are presenting separate ribbons for both juniors and amateurs in all classes and finals. We have also introduced leading non-pro rider awards in each division and a Legacy Cup Non Pro Team Award.

Also, new for 2002 is the introduction of the Legacy Cup Working Hunter Challenge for horses to jump four feet. This will include a Welcome class and the Working Hunter Stake. This is a \$5,000 added money division with 100% of the add-back money from these entries being isolated for this division. The last major change is to guarantee the winning purses for all divisions. These allow for great sponsorship opportunities, and for more add back money to be paid out in greater amounts to more people.

Once again, we have worked to design this event to be as exhibitor, spectator, and horse friendly as possible. We invite you to join us at this great facility in the beautiful and interesting Lexington, Virginia area. We look forward to seeing you at all of the social activities we have planned. USA EQUESTRIAN SPECIAL COMPETITION

The Legacy Cup has been approved for "Special Competition Status" in accordance with USA Equestrian Article 208.1

USA EQUESTRIAN ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a USA Equestrian recognized competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, or Handler and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Constitution and Rules of USA Equestrian ("the Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Constitution and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/ or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/ or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation Rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See Art. 1502.5.

"ARTICLE 211. AGREEMENT.

All applications for Federation recognition are accepted with the explicit agreement of competition officials that all classes (rated or unrated) to be held on a USA Equestrian recognized date must be recognized by the Federation and are governed by all applicable Federation rules, and that no unrecognized classes will be held on any date for which Federation recognition is requested, except that: (1) levels of Horse Trials (Eventing Competitions) below the Preliminary level, Combined Tests (Eventing Competitions) at all levels, and levels of Driving below the Intermediate Level, (2) classes for draft horses, (3) classes for miniature horses, (4) levels of Vaulting for which the Federation does not have division rules and (5) classes recognized by a national breed or discipline association and for which the Federation does not have division rules, can be unrecognized, only provided a separate entry blank is used and the prize list and/or Omnibus clearly states that the classes are not recognized by the Federation. Exception: FEI rules take precedence over National rules at all FEI Sanctioned Competitions."

MEMBERSHIP RULE, 1401.9.

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, COMBINED TRAINING/EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE INTERMEDIATE LEVEL OR ABOVE, DRESSAGE AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES PROVIDED THE RESPECTIVE BREED/DISCIPLINE DUES OR BREED/DISCIPLINE CATEGORY FEE HAS BEEN PAID. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, COMBINED TRAINING/EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$15. NON-MEMBER REGISTRATION FEE AND A \$5 BREED/DISCIPLINE CATEGORY FEE FOR EACH BREED/DISCIPLINE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES. ALSO EXEMPTED FROM THIS REQUIREMENT ARE RESIDENTS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO ARE MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR NATIONAL FEDERATION, AND 7) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES; AND (8) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO ARE MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR NATIONAL FEDERATIONS AND, IN THE CASE OF RIDERS, DRIVERS OR VAULTERS COMPETING IN DISCIPLINES RECOGNIZED BY THE FEI, IN POSSESSION OF A FOREIGN COMPETITOR'S LICENSE TO COMPETE IN NATIONAL COMPETITIONS, WHICH HAS BEEN ISSUED BY THE FEDERATION. (See Article 807.4 of the Federation rules).

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

To compete in the Legacy Cup riders, owners and trainers must be current members of the American Hunter-Jumper Foundation, Inc.

ADD BACK 50% OF ALL ENTRY FEES.

PRIZE MONEY will be credited to horse's accounts and will be available the following day. Money will be paid to the owner of record unless otherwise instructed on the entry blank. Prize money remaining at the conclusion of the show will be mailed.

RIBBONS will be awarded in the ring.

FORMAL ATTIRE is required for all Legacy Cup Finals Classes.

ENTRY PROCESS — The entry fee for each hunter division is \$1,000. A non-refundable entry deposit of \$150 must be paid with the stall fee and postmarked by April 1, 2002. Entries will be accepted with postmarks dated after April 1, 2002 for an additional entry fee of \$150. The balance of the fees, or an open check, will be due when picking up your entries at the show office.

REFUNDS — The \$150 entry deposit and stall fees are non-refundable. Other refunds will not be made after the start of the section.

ARRIVAL TIMES— Noon on Tuesday, April 30, 2002. Stalls may be available with prior arrangement by calling Oliver Kennedy 301-260-2467 or 443-255-6283. Arrivals by exhibitors that have not made arrangements shall be deemed unauthorized and shall incur an additional fee of 50% above Schedule.

***THERE WILL BE NO ARRIVALS BETWEEN THE HOURS OF MIDNIGHT AND 7:00 AM ***

DEPARTURE TIMES—All horses must vacate stalls by 8:00 am Monday, May 6th.

STALL FEES are \$125 per stall if payment is postmarked on or before April 1, 2002, \$135 if payment is postmarked after April 1, 2002. Stall fees must accompany the first entry payment. No stalls will be assigned until fees are paid. There are 750 permanent stalls with sliding metal doors available at noon on Monday, April 29, 2002. No stall refunds will be made after April 1st. A stall chart will be available in the Horse Show Office and will be posted for after office hours.

HAY, AND BEDDING will be available for purchase on the show grounds. All orders should be made in the Stable Office. Open checks (payable to the Virginia Horse Center) are required before delivery. Orders should be made accompanying the final entry payment. Feed is available at Rockbridge Farmer's Co-op, 540-463-7381.

CAMPER HOOK-UPS with water and power are available for a fee of \$150 for the show. The show office will collect camper fees. Please check in before you hook up.

CURRENT COGGINS TEST—All exhibitors must present a report of current negative Coggins test taken within one (1) year for each animal exhibited, to be admitted to and remain on the grounds, per The Virginia Department of Agriculture, Division of Animal Health.

SCHOOLING will be permitted the day prior to show from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. You may flat in the rings each morning. No morning schooling over fences.

POLING—There will be no manual poling or offsets allowed on the show grounds at any time.

HARD HATS must be worn by exhibitors at all times while mounted. Junior members are required to wear ASTM and SEI approved helmets at all times while mounted.

JUMP ORDERS will be posted each evening for the next day's activity. Late entries not on the class sheet will be put at the top of the order. All horses must be ridden in the posted order. Riders or trainers who have conflicts should inform the manager prior to the conflict so that necessary adjustment can be made to the order of go. At no time will the ring be held more than three (3) minutes.

THE LEGACY CUP COMMITTEE AND MANAGER reserve the right to reschedule, combine, close, add or delete classes or change the officials as may be necessary in the best interests of the show.

QUESTIONS AND DISPUTES will be brought in writing to the Legacy Cup Appeals Committee for resolution. The decision of the Legacy Cup Appeals Committee will be final and the entrant will accept such decision as final and hold the Legacy Cup Appeals Committee harmless for any action taken.

TESTING—All exhibitors may be subject to random drug testing as per USA Equestrian.

SOUNDNESS—All exhibitors will be judged for soundness.

COURSES will consist of hunter type jumps, first two go rounds will have approximately 8 jumps, finals will have 10-12 jumps.

ALL LEGACY CUP HUNTER DIVISIONS will be judged on performance and soundness. All rounds will be judged numerically by four teams of two judges. The scores will be added for a composite score. All finals will be run using a clean slate format. A tie breaking team of judges will be designated before each round. In the case of a tie, the score of the tie breaking team of judges will determine the winner.

VIRGINIA HORSE CENTER INFORMATION

GAS, ELECTRIC OR PROPANE HEATERS, PROPANE TANKS AND HOT PLATES are prohibited in stall areas, unless approved by the Virginia horse center management. Electric extension cords must be twelve gauge, three wire and prong negative ground type.

MANURE AND USED SHAVINGS removed from stalls or trailers must be placed in specific areas. These are the areas between the barn wall and the manure pit or other specified areas.

NO SMOKING in any buildings, rest rooms or stables

PARKING of cars, horse vans, and horse trailers will be permitted in designated areas only. Local fire regulations prohibit the parking of vehicles in the fire lane adjacent to stables.

PETS must be kept leashed, a maximum length of 6', at all times while on the show grounds and are the owner's responsibility. This is a county ordinance. No dogs will be allowed in the Indoor Arena, any office or around the food stand. Loose pets are subject to impoundment and a fine of \$100.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES, ATV's and motorcycles will not be permitted. Golf carts and mopeds must be operated by a licensed driver according to state laws. Minor's under the age of 16 must wear protective headgear when operating bicycles. Bicycles may not be ridden in barns or any part of the upper facility. Failure to comply will result in the impounding of the bicycle until close of show.

THE VIRGINIA HORSE CENTER has 750 permanent stalls, a 150 x 300' indoor coliseum with sand footing. All warm up areas have a combination of sand and Perma-flex footing.

LIMITED PRO HUNTER DIVISION*No Additional Entry Fee*

Riders must declare themselves to be a Limited Pro Rider. The Limited Pro status will be subject to the approval of the Legacy Cup Committee. A Limited Pro Rider is considered to be a new professional or one who has not consistently won at upper levels of hunter riding. The Limited Pro status will also be based on Legacy Cup money earnings. Rider's who have won more than \$3,500 at Legacy Cup competition or have placed first or second in Legacy Cup Pro 3', 3'6" or Limited Pro finals competition are ineligible to declare themselves as a Limited Pro Rider. Once a rider declares himself a pro rider or has moved up by money won, he is no longer eligible for Limited Pro competition.

Limited Pro riders are eligible for Limited Pro prize money in both go-rounds. They are also eligible for the Pro prize money if their ranking places them in the top 20 ribbons. Each entry's score from the first Go round will be added to the score from the second Go round to reach a composite score and a ranking. The top 10 ranked riders from this division will advance to the Limited Pro Finals.

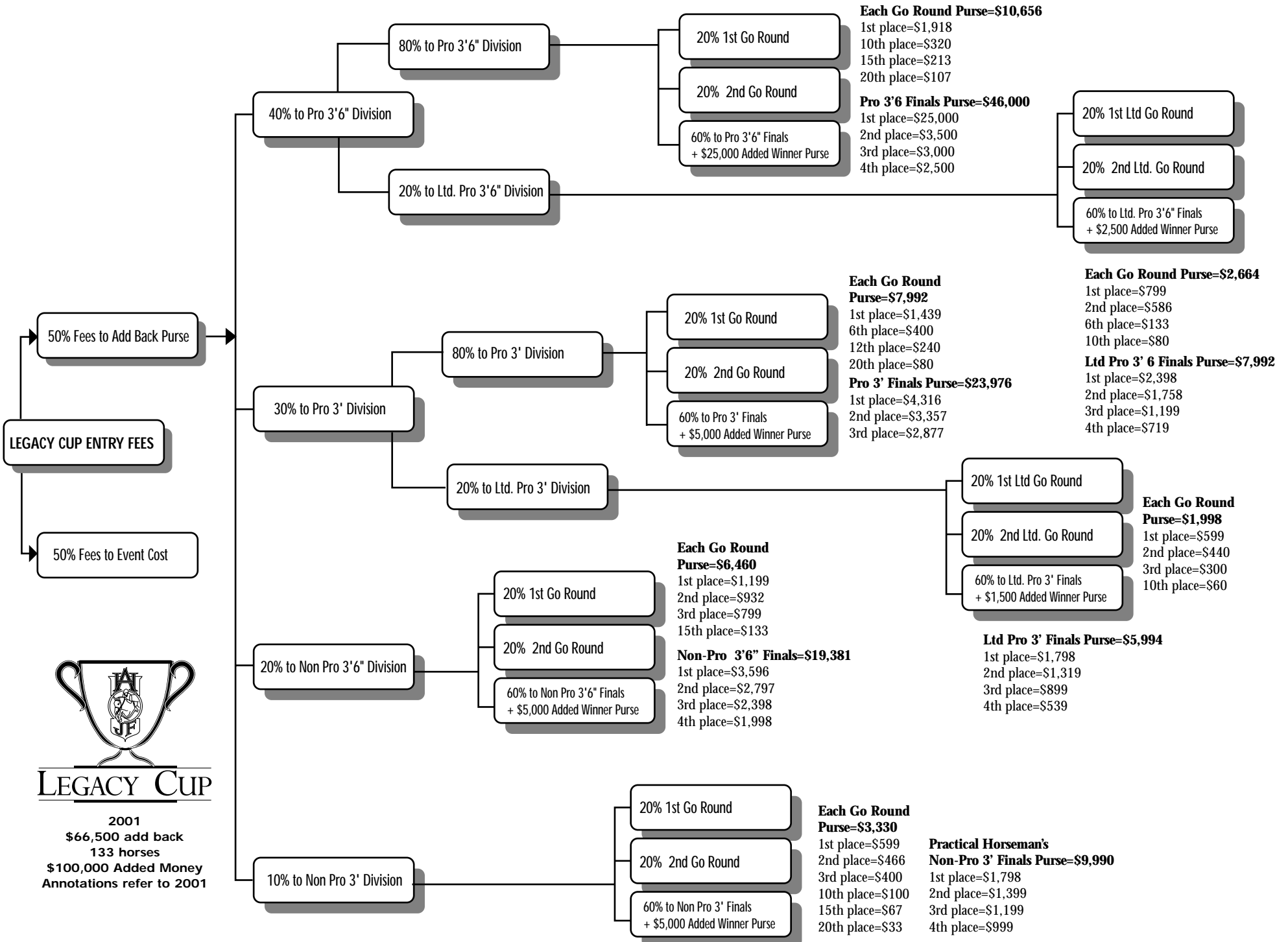
